Learning objective

Select, sequence and present creative work with captions that explain process, revision and learning.

Use this pack well

- Model the first example aloud, then let the learner try.
- Ask “How do you know?” more often than “Are you finished?”.
- Use real objects, talk, movement or observation when the activity suggests it.
- Stop or shorten the session if attention or enjoyment drops.
- Open-ended pages can have many successful answers.

Learn the idea

1 A portfolio is a purposeful selection, not every piece ever made.

2 Captions can explain materials, intention and revision.

3 Presentation choices affect how an audience experiences work.

Talk about it

Explain one idea in your own words. Give an example from real life, a drawing or an object if that helps.

Select four fictional works for different strengths.

Write a 30-word process caption.

Sequence works to create a clear journey.

Plan labels with readable text and respectful spacing.

Write a reflection that names one risk, one revision and one next skill.

Try it beyond the page

Real-world / hands-on connection

Choose two or three safe personal creations with a trusted adult and practise explaining why each was selected.

What evidence, object or example helped you?

What would you change if you tried again?

Answer & discussion notes

2. Suggested response

Useful context about process, idea or materials.

3. Suggested response

No; revision is part of creative development.

Review before publication

Check age fit, factual accuracy, clarity, accessibility, rights provenance and whether the activity works in practice. This file remains a review copy until those checks are signed off.
