Learning objective

Interpret simplified relief and contour-style clues to reason about slopes, valleys and route difficulty.

Use this pack well

- Model the first example aloud, then let the learner try.
- Ask “How do you know?” more often than “Are you finished?”.
- Use real objects, talk, movement or observation when the activity suggests it.
- Stop or shorten the session if attention or enjoyment drops.
- Open-ended pages can have many successful answers.

Learn the idea

1 Relief describes differences in land height and shape.

2 Closer contour-style lines represent steeper change in height on a simplified map.

3 Physical geography can influence transport, settlement and land use.

Talk about it

Explain one idea in your own words. Give an example from real life, a drawing or an object if that helps.

Order three slopes from gentle to steep using line spacing.

Trace a route that avoids the steepest fictional area.

Identify a valley clue between higher ground.

Compare where a road and walking trail might reasonably be placed.

Explain why a flat paper map can still communicate height.

Try it beyond the page

Real-world / hands-on connection

Use an adult-selected atlas or topographic-style map and identify one place where height clearly affects a route.

Before you finish

What did you notice?

What evidence, object or example helped you?

What would you change if you tried again?

1. What does relief describe?

2. What do closely spaced height lines usually suggest?

3. Why might builders consider slope?

Answer & discussion notes
