1. Keep it short

Use one or two activity pages at a time. Younger learners benefit from short, positive sessions.

2. Read the directions

An adult can read instructions aloud and model the first example when helpful.

3. Encourage thinking

Ask the learner to explain a choice, count aloud, sound out a word, or describe what they notice.

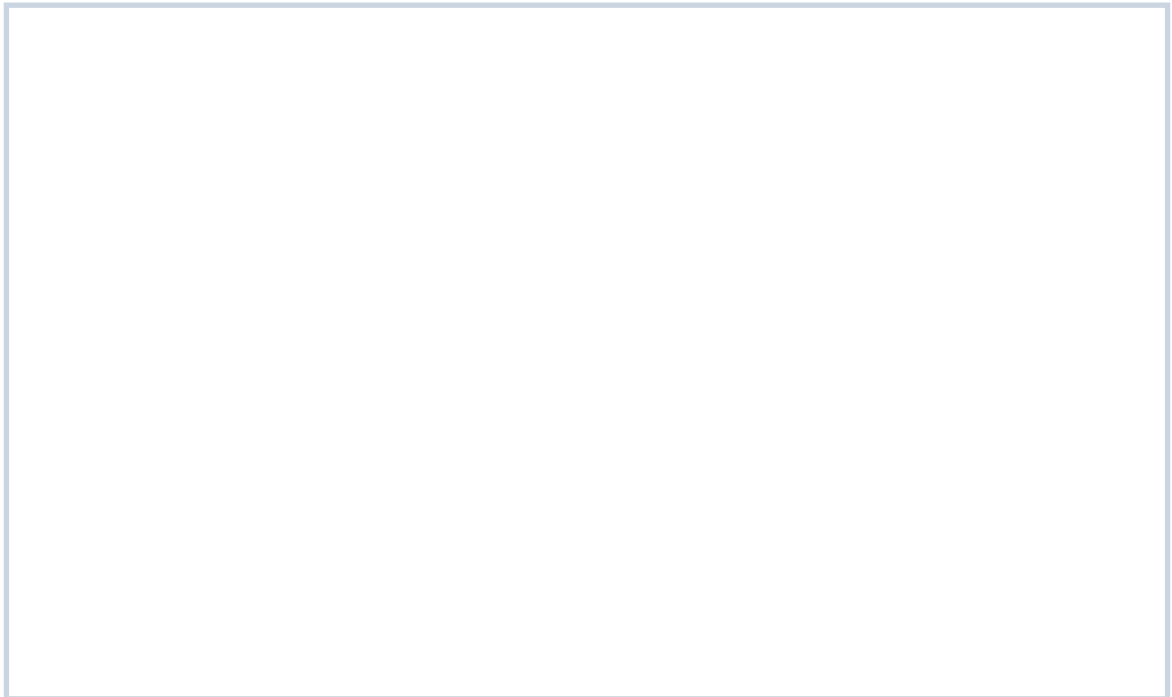
4. Revisit later

Repeat a page after a few days if the skill is still developing. Progress matters more than speed.

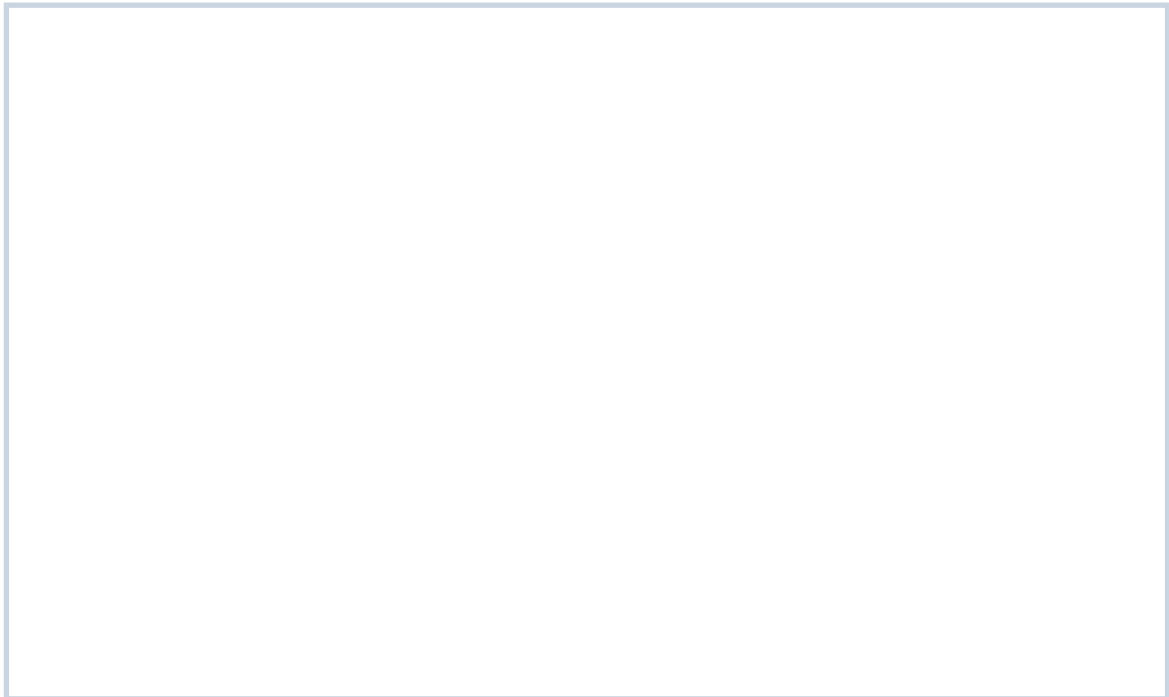
Name field

Write the learner name only on your printed copy if you wish. The public website does not need a child account to use this resource.

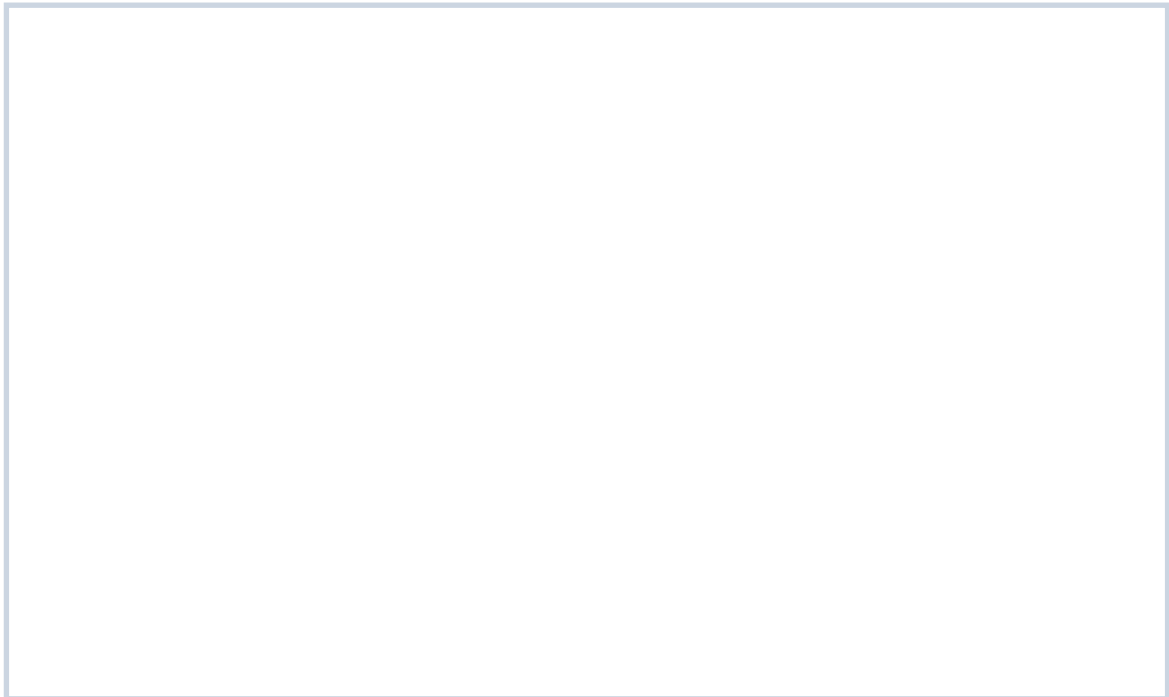
Luna carried a bright red kite to the grassy hill. The wind was gentle, and she hoped the kite would dance above the trees.



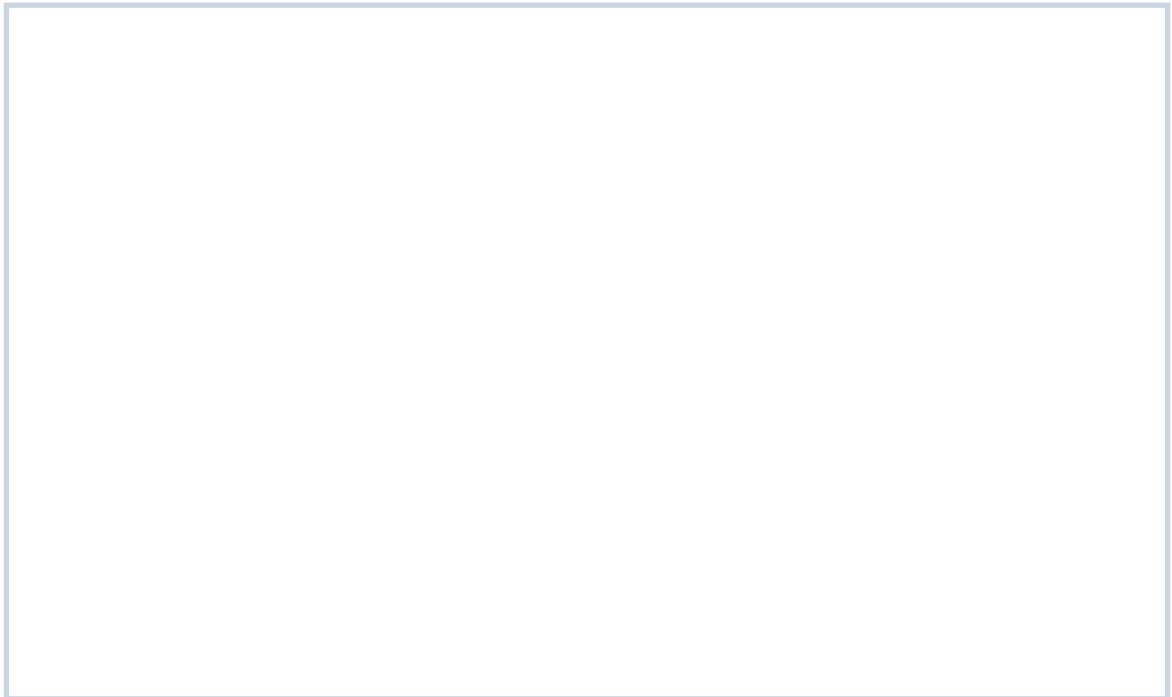
A stronger gust arrived. The kite lifted quickly, but its string caught around a low branch. Luna stopped and looked carefully.



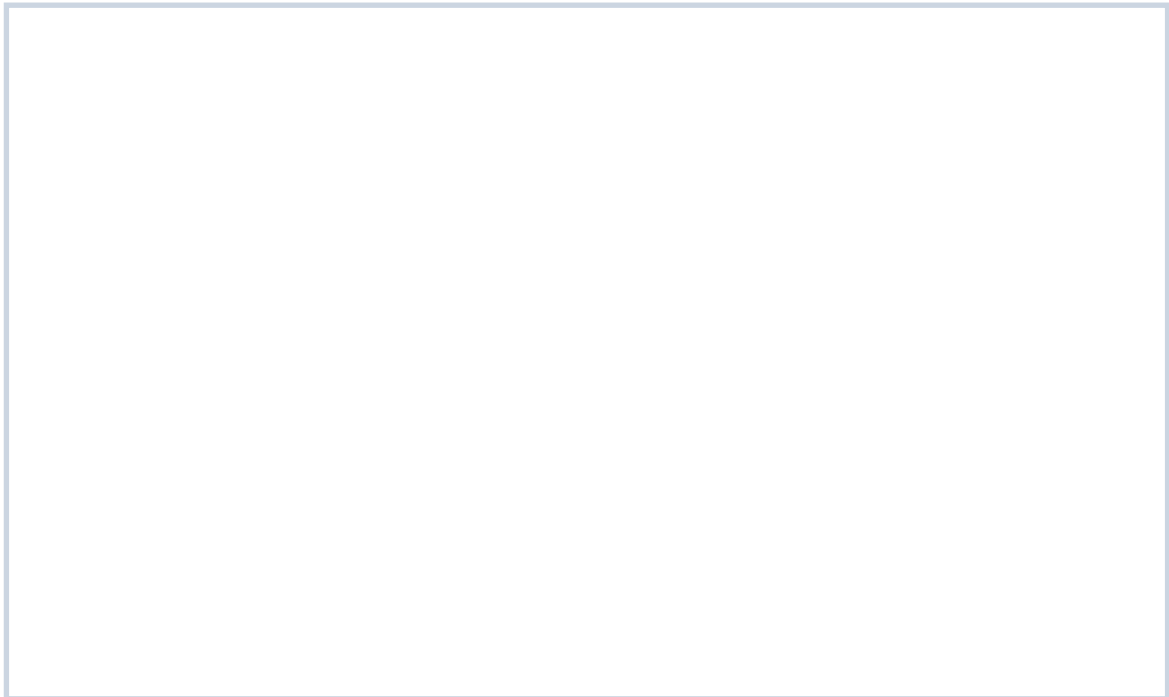
She did not pull hard. Her friend Arun held the reel while Luna asked an adult to help them reach the loose string safely.



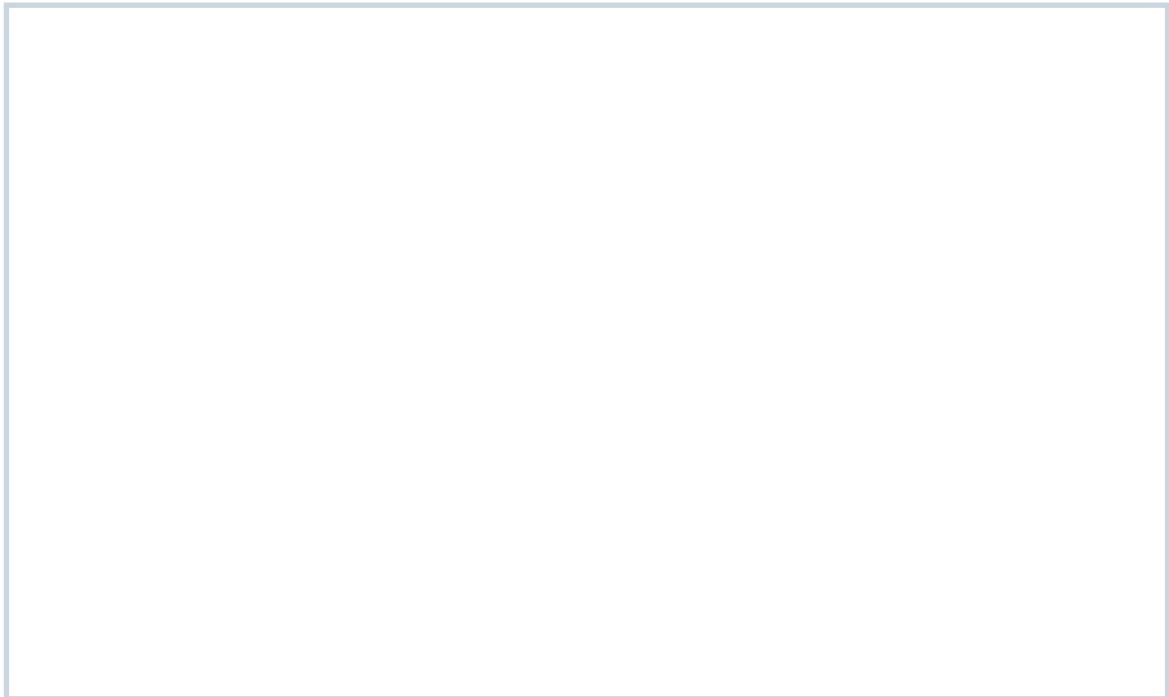
They moved to the side of the branch and slowly freed the string. Luna checked the kite. One corner was bent, but it was not torn.
